 Of Paul - to one PHILEMON.

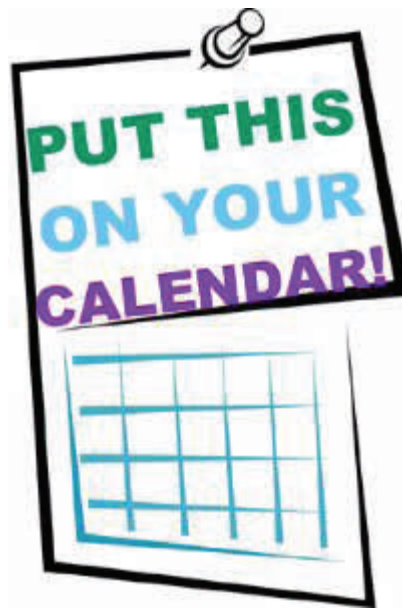
HEBREWS is a wondrous tale

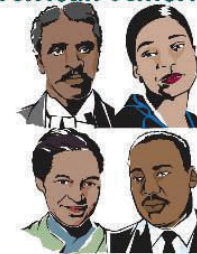

"I Have a Dream" is the popular name for the most famous public speech by Martin Luther King, Jr., when he spoke powerfully and eloquently of his desire for a future where blacks and whites would coexist harmoniously and as equals. King's delivery of the speech on August 28,

1963 from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial during the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom was a defining moment of the American Civil Rights Movement. The speech is often considered to be one of the greatest speeches in history and was ranked the number 1 speech of the 20th century by Rhetoric scholars.

"When we let freedom ring, when we let it ring from every village and every hamlet, from every state and every city, we will be able to speed up that day when all of God's children, black men and white men, Jews and Gentiles, Protestants and Catholics, will be able to join hands and sing in the words of the old Negro spiritual, "Free at last! free at last! thank God Almighty, we are free at last!"
